

RENVILLE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS  
FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL 2023

APRIL 4, 2023

Board convened at 9:00 a.m. Present: Chairman Robert Marmon, Commissioner Jamee Hansen and Commissioner Andy Gates.

Kristy Titus, DES Coordinator, met with the Board to discuss the county burn policy. She proposed no changes from the prior year.

Comm. Hansen introduced the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

**Resolution 2023-7**

**FIRE EMERGENCY**

**And**

**AUTOMATIC OPEN BURN POLICY PROCLAMATION**

**For**

**RENVILLE COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA**

April 4, 2023

WHEREAS, Renville County, North Dakota has endured dry conditions

WHEREAS, Renville County has either sustained or been threatened with rural fires as of this date; and

WHEREAS, all available resources remain committed to protecting life and property; and

WHEREAS, the impact of fires could threaten the health, well-being, and safety of citizens in Renville County; and

WHEREAS, the cost of response and the inordinate equipment wear may be far in excess of available County resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Renville County Commissioners, pursuant to NDCC 37-17.1-10, declares a Fire Emergency and an Automatic Burn Policy (including a ban on the ignition of fireworks, campfires, fire pits, fire rings, recreational fires, garbage burning, pit burning, burning of farm land/ditches) remain in effect **whenever the North Dakota Fire Danger Rating is in the High, Very High or Extreme Status and/or a Red Flag warning has been issued for Renville County, North Dakota.**


This policy will remain in effect until further notice. **ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES THIS BURN POLICY IS GUILTY OF A CLASS B**

**MISDEMEANOR (UP TO 30 DAYS IN JAIL AND A \$1,500.00 FINE). THE RENVILLE COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE CITATIONS TO VIOLATORS.**

Motion seconded by Comm. Gates. On vote all voted aye and none voted nay and the resolution was duly adopted.

Joel Bohm met with the Board to discuss issues he has with a township road from County Road #4 to his home (38<sup>th</sup> Ave NW). After discussing the issue, Chairman Marmon stated that since the road is a township road, the concerns need to be addressed to the Hurley Township board.

Sean Mattern, Road Supervisor, met with the Board. He updated the Board on repairs to equipment in his department. He received an estimate for \$7,400.00 to repair the International truck. The Board approved that repair. The mulcher has been repaired and one of the motorgraders required a minor repair. He will be putting up load restrictions as of Monday, April 10, 2023. Comm. Gates asked Sean if he has looked at restructuring the motorgrader routes. Sean will see how spring goes with the crew, he has swapped some routes between operators.

Chad Schmidt, Custodian, met with the Board to discuss accrued vacation time. Chad has not been able to use his vacation hours and with the cold season he accrues compensation time also. Moved by Comm. Hansen, second by Comm. Gates to pay out 40 hours of accrued vacation time. The Board will look at Chad's hours again in October. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

Moved by Comm. Gates, second by Comm. Hansen to remove two items from inventory. Item # 1369, a phone intercom system and #707, a fan. Neither item works. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

The Board discussed Senate Bill 2239 and House Bill 1040. They are in support of SB2239 and oppose HB1040. Both bills deal with how the ND Public Employee Retirement system operates.

Comm. Gates introduced the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

## RENVILLE COUNTY

### RESOLUTION 2023-8

#### RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF LEGISLATION TO MAINTAIN THE EXISTING NDPERS DEFINED BENEFIT MAIN PLAN

**WHEREAS**, there is legislation proposed under Senate Bill #2239 relating to employer and employee contribution rates to support the existing public employees defined benefit main plan and to provide for participation in the public employees retirement system defined contribution plan, and

**WHEREAS**, Renville County and numerous political subdivisions have been in partnership with the State of North Dakota for over 50 years in the NDPERS and have shown their commitment to the retirement system, and

**WHEREAS**, the Renville County Commission recognizes there is an unfunded liability problem and has never opposed employer or employee contribution increases that the ND Legislature determined necessary or disagreed with past legislative efforts made to put the defined benefit plan on the road to recovery by reducing the multiplier from 2.00% to 1.75% and changing the Rule of 85 to the Rule of 90, and

**WHEREAS**, additional efforts are proposed under SB #2239 providing a cash infusion of \$250,000,000 in the 2023-2025 biennium and increased employee and/or employer contributions beginning in January of 2024 to reduce the unfunded liability in the main system retirement plan, and

**WHEREAS**, a defined benefit plan is a great tool for recruitment and retention of employees, especially in areas of North Dakota where there is a workforce shortage and where political subdivisions are in direct competition with the private industry in attracting qualified employees, and

**WHEREAS**, legislation under SB #2239 not only provides for participation in a defined benefit plan but also offers public employees the choice of participating in a defined benefit or a defined contribution plan, giving political subdivisions an even more attractive recruitment tool by allowing this choice, and

**WHEREAS**, the passage of SB #2239 would allow future State Legislatures a means to evaluate whether the implementation of contribution increases along with the cash infusion delivers a positive outcome for the continuance of the defined benefit program; and

**WHEREAS**, the passage of SB #2239 would allow political subdivisions to gauge whether employees prefer a defined benefit program versus a defined contribution rather than State Legislatures taking a more drastic approach of working towards the elimination of the defined benefit plan that not only benefits employees but the economy as a whole, and

**WHEREAS**, the Teacher's Retirement Plan, a successful defined benefit program, is on the road to recovery and there are other workable defined benefit programs administered through the State which demonstrates a defined benefit plan can be maintained and offered as a

choice for all dedicated public employees across the State of North Dakota, and

**WHEREAS**, political subdivisions will have a financial obligation regardless of the outcome of the defined benefit plan; Renville County chooses to be part of a solution to make the existing plan solvent as the alternative to close the plan under House Bill #1040 proposes greater uncertainties to political subdivisions and their employees.

**NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED**, the Board of Renville County Commissioners **supports Senate Bill # 2239** and their continued long-standing partnership with the State as a participant in the NDPERS Defined Benefit Main Plan.

**FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED**, the Board of Renville County Commissioners **opposes House Bill #1040** which closes the defined benefit program that has been offered as a benefit for decades to by far the State's greatest assets, its employees.

Motion seconded by Comm. Hansen. On vote all voted aye and none voted nay and the resolution was duly adopted.

Correspondence addressed to the Board's attention was reviewed and discussed. Officers reports were reviewed and filed. March payroll and travel requests were approved as presented.

Moved by Comm. Hansen, second by Comm. Gates that the minutes of March 2023 be approved with one correction. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

Moved by Comm. Hansen, second by Comm. Gates that the quarterly reports for the period ended March 31, 2023 be approved and accepted. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

Moved by Comm. Gates, second by Comm. Hansen to approve the construction contract with Mayo Construction for CP-3823(023) Mohall North and CP-3836(023) Glenburn West. The bid for the project is \$1,680,795.16. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye. The project will be done this summer.

Moved by Comm. Hansen, second by Comm. Gates to approve temporary work easements with the ND Department of Transportation for a sidewalk and curb project on main street in Mohall. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

Roger Hutchinson, Sheriff, met with the Board. There are two new employees, one is working full time now and the other will be done with the Academy in May and then begin working full time for the department. He also has two deputies working part-time. They are helping to fill shifts while one deputy is doing field training.

Sheriff Hutchinson asked the Board to consider moving his department retirement plan from the "Main" ND Public Employee Retirement plan to the "Public Safety" retirement plan. Both plans are with ND PERS. The change in retirement plans would be an increase in cost to the County of approximately \$5,000.00 per year. Roger stated that the Public Safety retirement plan is a helpful recruitment benefit. The Board discussed the proposed change for the sheriff's department.

Moved by Comm. Hansen, second by Comm. Gates for Renville County to affirm to North Dakota Public Employees Retirement System that Renville County is formed pursuant to N.D.C.C. §11-01-39 and is neither a non-profit corporation nor a for-profit corporation, to join the NDPERS Public Safety Defined Benefit Retirement Plan and offer the plan to all eligible employees of Renville County. The Board approved joining the NDPERS Public Safety Defined Benefit Retirement Plan effective May 1, 2023. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

Moved by Comm. Gates, second by Comm. Hansen to purchase a cross-cut shredder from Gaffaney's of Minot. The cost is \$5,399.00 less the trade in value of \$1,900.00 for the old shredder, with final cost at \$3,499.00. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

Moved by Comm. Gates, second by Comm. Hansen to approve the purchase of 6 canvass bound "Commissioner Proceedings" binders and two reams of punched cotton paper. Total cost is \$2,792.00. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

The Board received a request from the Paranormal Investigators of North Dakota. They would like to investigate the hospital building in Mohall City. The building is currently owned by the County. The Board discussed liability issues. The building is in a state of disrepair. Moved by Comm. Gates, second by Comm. Hansen to deny the request for access to the hospital building. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

The Board discussed the proposed Elmer Jesme Conference of Counties guidelines.

APRIL 18, 2023

Board convened at 9:00 a.m. Present: Chairman Robert Marmon, Commissioner Jamee Hansen and Commissioner Andy Gates.

Jim Thompson and Steve Thompson, Eden Valley Township board members, met with the Board to discuss an intersection that has seen flooding over the last several years. The intersection is located 4 miles north and 2 miles west of Loraine. Currently there are four 36" culverts and two 48" culverts. This system is not handling the water that needs to pass through the intersection. It is rated for a 15 year flood event but has seen flooding several times in the past 10 years. The township board is looking for funding options such as State grants. The County will have two box culverts available this summer and the township could use those in the proposed project. Steve and Jim will talk to Farden Construction to get an estimate for an upgraded system. The County has a

hydrology study of the area from 2011. A copy was given to the township.

Sean Mattern, Road Supervisor, met with the Board. The load restrictions were put up on April 10<sup>th</sup>. He has also rearranged two motorgrader routes and will see how they work.

Comm. Marmon spoke to a McKinney Township officer concerning the west access road into the Mouse River Park. McKinney Township board did not think the legal description was correct on the Assignment of Road Easement. Comm. Marmon will ask the township board to make any corrections they feel are necessary and return the form to the County. The Board of Commissioners will then have the State's Attorney review the changes.

Chad Schmidt and the Board toured the outside of the Courthouse building. A downspout needs to be replaced on the southeast corner of the building. Chad will gather information and an estimate for replacement. They also inspected the front steps. Keller Construction refaced the cement last fall and it is already crumbling. Auditor Pollman will contact Ted Keller to see when he will be coming to make repairs.

Moved by Comm. Hansen, second by Comm. Gates to remove from inventory item #262, a shredder and item #1784, a computer monitor. The shredder was traded in on the new shredder and the monitor no longer works and was discarded. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

Moved by Comm. Hansen, second by Comm. Gates to approve the engagement of Rath & Mehrer, Certified Public Accountants, to audit fiscal year 2022 for the County. Motion carried by unanimous vote of aye.

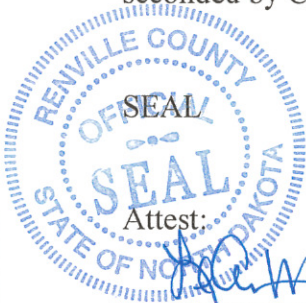
